## **Getting Inbounds ENGAGED!**

Getting your inbound students engaged with their peers at school, their school Interact Club, their host families, and their sponsoring Rotary Club is critical to the short- and long-term success of the student AND the program. Here are some helpful tips:

- Get your student on a school sports team cross country and tennis are, at many high schools, sports that someone can participate in without much experience or a high level of skill...and they tend to be large teams
- Get your student involved in drama or the arts
- Have your student act as greeter at all Rotary Club meetings they attend and have them introduce themselves to your club
- Share your student's "bucket list" (which they will develop at the inbound orientation on August 29-30) with the Rotary Club and the student's host family(ies)
- Invite the host family(ies) to Rotary meetings before the student arrives and throughout the year
- Invite your student to volunteer at service projects with your
- Write a welcome proclamation for your city and present your student at a city council meeting
- Have the students engage in "family" activities...from grocery shopping, to family game nights, to movie nights.

# **Bucket Lists**

At the inbound orientation on August 29-30, every student will create a "bucket list" of things they hope to see, do, try, eat, etc., while they are in the USA on

exchange. It is NOT the expectation that the students will complete these "bucket lists", but we have found that these lists are GREAT conversation starters and easy ways for local Rotarians to engage with the students. The lists, historically, have ranged from: "I want to ride a horse", to "I want to touch snow for the first time", to "I want to go to a high school American football game."
