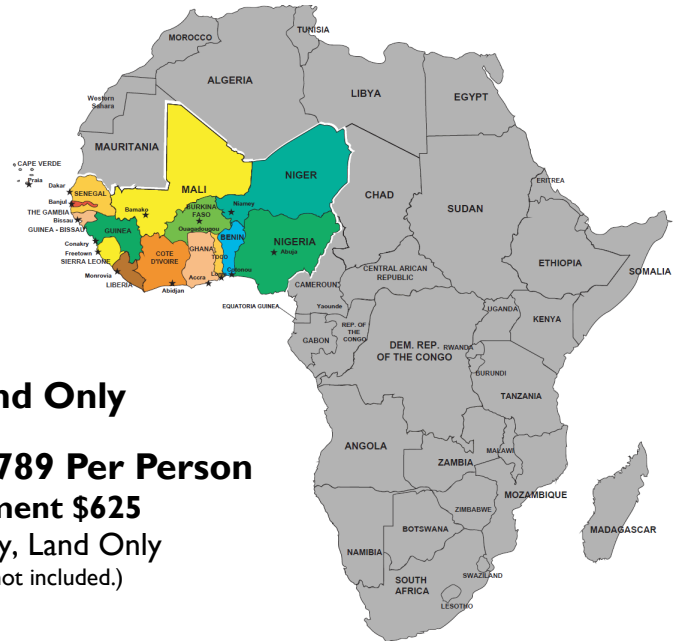

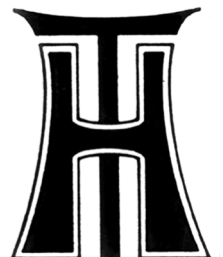
We spend two days in the field connecting with the local communities, including: immunizations of the children of Ghana, and a second day of visits to Rotary club project sites.

Mon., Oct., 28 - Depart North America

Tue., Oct. 29 - Arrive in Accra, Ghana: Evening arrival in Accra Hotel transfer provided for group members on specified flights. First-class accommodations at the **La Palm Royal Beach Hotel**, which includes daily breakfasts and internet.

Wed., Oct. 30 – Accra: Today, we explore the capital city of Accra. Sightseeing includes the W.E.B Dubois Centre for Pan African Culture, the Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park, Independence Square, Christianborg Castle, etc. Lunch is provided as a tour service. Afternoon visit to the U.S. Embassy for a briefing. This evening, we attend a welcome reception/orientation at the hotel.



Thu., Oct. 31 - Family Health Day: Today we join the local Rotarians who will take us into Accra's rural communities for hands-on participation in a Family Health Camp that will provide a range of services for children and community members. Treatments will include immunization for childhood diseases, including polio, and malaria, HIV, hypertension, glaucoma, diabetes, etc. Today is both an emotional and enlightening experience as you connect with the children of Africa. Lunch will be provided. This evening we attend a dinner event hosted by the District Governor.

Fri., Nov. 1 - Community Service/Humanitarian Day: This morning members of the Rotary clubs of Accra will take us into the local communities to see their projects that are creating lasting change. The purpose of today is to create friendships and be exposed to the community service and humanitarian programs of Rotary. Tonight we participate an Inter-City meeting with the Rotary clubs in and around Accra. This event will enable friendships with Rotarians from Ghana and West Africa.

Sat., Nov. 2 - West Africa Project Fair: The West Africa Project Fair starts giving you the ability to engage with Rotarians and their projects from 15 West African nations. Today's events include the Opening Ceremony, and visits to club booths to explore their projects. Lunch is provided. This evening is free for individual enjoyment.



Sun., Nov. 3 West Africa Project Fair: We continue to visit the Project Fair booths to learn about the projects of the West African clubs and discover how to join them in addressing their humanitarians needs. Lunch is included. Tonight, we attend a special closing dinner and entertainment event.

Mon., Nov. 4 – Accra: Today, we travel to the beach side community of Kokrobite to see a special project and to experience rural Ghanaian life and the customs of the Ga Tribe. Lunch is provided.



Tue., Nov. 5 - Accra/Last Minute Shopping/Depart for Home: This morning we enjoy last minute shopping, rest and free time to connect with the local Rotarians. We join with the local Rotarians for a farewell event before our evening flight from Accra.

Thu., Nov. 6 – Arrive in North America.

Rotarian Purpose

The West Africa Project Fair (WAPF) was Rotary's first humanitarian project fair in Africa, as a part of Rotary's Reach Out to Africa initiative. It was created by Rotarians from 15 West African nations to facilitate partnerships and projects that will make a significant contribution to the needs of this continent.

By joining this program, you will work with the local Rotarians to understand how important Rotary is to their communities. You will also have the opportunity to select and support Rotary Foundation projects during the Fair, engage in field work in the local communities, create strong friendships with the West African Rotarians, and participate in hands-on humanitarian and health related field work. #



Participate in: Family Health Camp, Project Site Visitations, and West Africa Project Fair:

You will have the opportunity to look into the eyes of a child as you give them vaccines that will change their future health. Our team will participate in a Family Health Camp which includes routine immunizations, such as for polio, in a rural community outside of Accra. In addition to making a difference in the lives of children of Ghana, you will have extraordinary experiences, and develop a unique insight into the life and challenges in Africa. Together with Ghanaian Rotarians you will witness the work of Rotary and The Rotary Foundation.

Passport, Visa and Health Requirements:

All U.S. citizens are required to have a valid passport and Ghanaian visa. The cost of obtaining your passport, visa and inoculations are not included in the tour price. It is your responsibility to apply and pay for the following items:

U.S. Passport: Must be valid at least six months after your scheduled return to the U.S.

Ghanaian Visa for all U.S. citizens: Information on applying for the visa will be sent to you with your trip confirmation materials. Allow two weeks to process the visa application.

Required Inoculations: The Center for Disease Control (<http://www.cdc.gov>) states that a yellow fever inoculation is required. They also recommend that U.S. citizens take precautions against malaria and other diseases. Please consult your physician to determine precautions appropriate for you.

Special Airfare Note: Tour price does NOT include round trip airfare. This tour is offered to Rotarians throughout the U.S., making it impossible to anticipate and include the necessary flight itineraries in our tour price. In Aug/Sep, after our group has formed, we will offer all North American members the most appropriate flight options. Alternatively, you are free to purchase your round trip airfare or use frequent flyer mileage.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Bank Trustee Account & Financial Responsibilities: Payments are deposited in a Bank of America, Oakland, CA, trustee account, used exclusively for this program. By law, Howard Tours cannot and will not use these funds for purposes other than to defray the program costs. While the money is in the bank, Bank of America and NOT Howard Tours, is custodian of the funds. When the travel service companies are paid, Howard Tours will have met its financial and trustee obligations for the travel services involved.

Per Person Prices Include: (1) Double occupancy hotel accommodations; (2) Meals, cruises and special events as specified in itinerary; (3) Private, guided motorcoach sightseeing with English speaking guide; (4) Entrance fees; (5) Tips to local guides and tour hotel porters; (6) Project Fair Registration; (7) Other Rotary events; and (7) Other values as detailed in the itinerary.

Prices do NOT include: (1) All airfares; (2) Passport and visa fees, if any; (3) Airport departure taxes; (4) Government taxes, or airline fees (e.g., baggage fees); (5) Insurance; (6) All personal expenses, (e.g., phone, laundry, etc.); (7) All health and medical services, and related expenses; (8) Refunds for missed or unused services; (9) Accommodations in excess of the nights listed in the itinerary; (10) Overnight delivery fees or delivery fees for clients outside the continental U.S.; (11) Meals not specified in the itineraries; (12) Airport/hotel transfers, unless noted in itinerary. (13) COVID testing; (14) Any/all additional expenses related to delays, quarantines, medical expenses, accommodations/meals, etc., caused by a positive COVID test or diagnosis.

Conditions of Prices: Prices are based on the relative value between the U.S. dollar and the currencies of the countries listed when tours are priced and the folder published. If the exchange rates, taxes or other travel costs change, or if the minimum size of the group is not achieved, the traveler may be assessed any extra charges or refunds. By joining this program, you acknowledge that travelers may be charged additional sums by the airlines, and therefore Howard Tours, to offset increased fees, fuel surcharges, taxes, fluctuations in foreign exchange markets or any combination thereof, and therefore you consent to any post-purchase price increases. Howard Tours accepts Credit Cards for final payment.

Changes of Itinerary: Howard Tours reserves the right to change the itinerary or services for reasons which may be out of our control, (e.g.,: airline schedule changes, number of people who join a tour, natural disasters, etc.) If changes are necessary, the traveler may be assessed any extra charges or refunds.

Cancellations & Other Charges: Cancellations must be made by letter, E-mail, or fax and NOT by telephone. Partial or total cancellation of tour services, regardless of reason, are subject to: (1) Funds that may be withheld or imposed by the airlines, hotels, cruise lines, sightseeing companies, etc.; (2) A per person Howard Tours' cancellation service fee, prorated before departure, as follows: \$400 up to 46 days before departure, and \$600 within 45 days of departure. Cancellations within 30 days of departure are fully non-refundable. Travelers whose changes result in rewritten air tickets will be charged whatever penalties the airlines may impose, and a Howard Tours \$50 service fee. Those applying within 45 days of departure will be assessed extra expenses caused by late enrollment, with a minimum charge of \$50 per person.

Because the airlines, hotels, and the impact of contracting COVID during the trip, etc. can impose heavy cancellation fees and expenses, we strongly recommend the purchase of "Cancellation Insurance," which is available through the Howard Tours website. The insurance provided by Travelex offers COVID coverage. Please read the terms and conditions of the coverage for details.
