How to Become a Peacebuilder Club



Min # of Rotarians: 2

Prep time: 2 hours

Est cost: \$40

Avg Service Time: 2 presentations/year + advisory & events

To form a Rotary Peacebuilder Club, your Rotary club must officially partner with the Rotary Action Group for Peace (RAGFP). This designation shows a commitment to tackling the root causes of conflict by focusing on peace and conflict resolution as a core area of service.

5 Steps (see inside for details):

1. Form a Peace Committee
2. Join the RAGFP
3. Review the Standards
4. Apply Online
5. Ongoing Activities

How to: Become a Peacebuilder Club



1. **Form a Peace Committee**

- Create a **Peace Committee** within your existing Rotary or Rotaract club. See **How to Form a Peace Committee** in Resource tab of this Website.

2. **Join the RAGFP**

- At least **two members** of your Peace Committee must become paid members of the Rotary Action Group for Peace <https://www.rotaryactiongroupforpeace.org/engage/>

Est Cost: \$20 for Rotary and \$5 for Rotaract.

3. **Review the Standards**

- The committee should review the RAGFP Peacebuilder Club Standards to align your club with Rotary's peace goals. RAGFP: <https://www.rotaryactiongroupforpeace.org/engage/>

4. **Apply Online**

- Apply via the RAGFP Peacebuilder Club Online Application

- Share your designation when received with Club leadership and District Peace Chair.

5. **Ongoing Activities** *See Resources!*

- Conduct at least two brief peacebuilding presentations or trainings per year during Club meetings..
- Highlight how every Rotary project in all seven Areas of Focus contributes to community building and peace.
- Organize Positive Peace conversations, activities, and projects with Club and District members.
- Support peace education sessions at District Assemblies, Conferences, or in partnership with other peacebuilder communities.
- Update the Peacebuilder Club Application Form every July to reflect the Club's new Committee members.
